Approval of Minutes for November 1, 2021---Motion to approve from Grace Tea, seconded by Jennifer Carr and approved unanimously.

Mr. Stromberg asked that when they write suggestions, and list specific things we could do to improve. - This week finishing up groups. They went well, and we have had more participation than ever.
- Counseling department will be doing Class Schedule Changes when we come back from winter break and last 2 weeks before the 2nd semester begins. They will be doing phone calls and emails.
- Looked over the F and U's paperwork and there were many students with credit recovered. We are so thankful for the Academic coaches working with our struggling students. Community Council members wanted to talk about numbers from year to year. Mr. Plant explained that the 9th grade teachers were used to doing credit recovery and that might be why we are seeing more success in the 9th grade. The 7th and 8th teachers are catching up. Also in the reporting it showed all the F's received and we only focus on recovering F's from the core classes (Math, English, Science, and Social Studies)

Mr. Stromberg explained that the academic coaches are being paid with Essr II funds. But if
we want to continue to have our Academic coaches for all 3 grades in school year 20232024, we need to consider paying them with the Trust land funds.
